Octavia Yearwood is the lead curator on Art in the Gardens festival and exhibition. Yearwood was the 2016 American Express Emerging Arts Leader Awardee by Americans For The Arts and has been both cultivating and fostering high caliber arts experience for youth in Miami-Dade while supporting local artist, over the last few years since relocating from New York City. **Principal Tamika Lewis** is a Miami native, born and raised in the Wynwood area. Lewis opened the school primarily as an after school program and has since transformed it into a non-profit private school providing top tier education in both academia and the arts. Lewis says, "I have just always loved the arts. When I was younger I loved to dance and let my mother know I wanted to take dance classes. She said 'I can't afford to pay for dance classes, how you gon eat?'. I couldn't do it as a child and I don't want any child to not be able to do it."
